The Sound of Iona tartan has recently been designed and woven in Scotland and was inspired by the colours of the sand, sea and rocks of Iona. Lying off the west coast of Scotland, the island of Iona has the mighty Atlantic Ocean on its western shore and the shallow waters of the Sound of Iona separating it from its near neighbour the Isle of Mull. In the early 20th century, Scottish colourists made regular painting

**DID YOU KNOW?**

The **Isle of Iona** is home to a very rare migratory bird, The Corncrake is a skulking land rail that is more often heard than seen. Males arriving from their wintering quarters in South-east Africa in late April rasp their characteristic 'crek-crek' call to attract a mate. Male Corncrakes call throughout the day and night and each bird will rasp up to 1,000,000 times during a single breeding season!

The waters around Mull and Iona are rich with marine life, one of which is the Basking Shark, the second largest fish in the world and which is mostly seen from June to September following plankton blooms. Minke whale appear during the months of April & May, and stay long into the autumn months, when the seas are at their warmest. Common dolphins are seen from the boats in larger pods feeding and passing through hebridean waters, whereas bottlenose dolphins are seen from land and seen playing and feeding in local waters. Fionnphort and Iona are the shortest route to Staffa, where you can see the legendary basalt rock formation of Fingal's Cave and the Treshnish Isles and the colony of puffins and other sea birds.
